After completing PGDEMS from first batch in SIHS, was identified by Dr. Prasad Rajhans one of the first EMS Officers in newly started EMS (Dial-105) from Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital, Pune and worked relentlessly for 2 Years to put a strong foundation of EMS in Pune. Was able to save hundreds of lives including 10 successful resuscitations on the field. Had been a visiting faculty at SIHS for PGDEMS imparting key concepts and practical training to New PGDEMS Students, while contributing further in terms of BLS - ACLS, PALS Training as

an Instructor.

Pursued an unforeseen opportunity to study and work in the UK only through the guidance of visionary Dr. Prasad Rajhans. Worked as a Project Manager in NHS following post - graduation from London Southbank University. This further helped shape a leadership and managerial role in Maharashtra EMS.

Worked in Maharashtra EMS (Dial-108) from Initiation and Planning to Implementation and now in Operations for four Years now. Have been able to provide key inputs in the planning and implementation, have overseen implementation and Operations in three Zones, provided BLS - ACLS training to EMS Officers in these Zones. Currently managing MEMS West Maharashtra with 430 Ambulances and about 1000 EMS Officers with a dedicated Team.

Had an opportunity to implement CATS -102 EMS Service in New Delhi with implementation of new Ambulances, Processes, training and deployment of New Paramedics etc.
